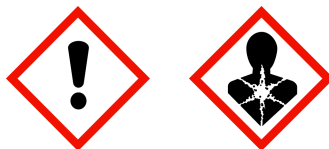

### SECTION 4: First aid measures

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

##### General information

Remove contaminated soaked clothing immediately.
